
CHECK BEFORE YOU CHOP 1050 Code of Clearing Practice: Changes to the Legislation and how it affects you

There have been some significant changes in the legislation concerning a landowner's ability to cut down trees and clear their land in the last year.

If you want to cut down a tree (within 10 m of your house) or clear smaller vegetation (within 50 m of your house) because you worried about it putting your house at risk from bushfire you need to check whether you are located in the 1050 vegetation

clearing entitlement area. You should do this by going to the Rural Fire Service's online tool on the day that you are clearing. http://www.rfs.nsw.gov.au/planand-prepare/1050-vegetationclearing/tool#tool

If you live in certain parts of Beecroft and Cheltenham such as a Local heritage area you may no longer be able to cut down trees or clear vegetation because these are now exempt. See the map below.


As the result of resident lobbying, the Hornsby Shire Council can advise that Fearnley Park due to its critically endangered ecologically community of Blue Gum High Forest no longer holds a 10/50 vegetation clearing entitlement.

The RFS is able to exclude low risk pockets of bushland from the scheme if it is satisfied that council has appropriate mitigation strategies in place

STOP PRESS: **Byles Creek Valley Update 9th October** 2015

As of Friday 9th October, Hornsby Council have officially rejected DA/94/2013 for 79-87 Malton Rd Beecroft. The Applicant stated he was not willing to complete the ecological and environmental assessments as deemed as a result of the Ecological Report by Dr Smith and consequently, Council had no option other than to deem refusal of the DA.

FIVE YEARS ON, RESIDENTS STILL WAITING FOR A LIFT



Trust Committee members Peter Snelgrove, Dr Barbara Davis & President Kent Ross presented the petition to NSW MP Damien Tudehope.

On 14th September, your Trust representatives met with our NSW MP, Damien Tudehope, to deliver a petition containing 2109 signatures in support of a lift at Beecroft railway station. Trust President Kent Ross noted that the NSW Government seemed intent on spending millions on a much-lessneeded bridge, across Beecroft Road, at the Beecroft public school. At the same time, Beecroft

had a shopping centre, retirement housing and bus interchange that were crying out for lift access. MP Tudehope noted the ageing local demographic, along with more young families with prams, and that Beecroft was the only station without a lift between Pennant Hills and Eastwood. He agreed to present the Petition to the NSW Minister for Transport.

The petition, compiled after hundreds of hours dedicated work by Beecroft-Cheltenham Civic Trust resident volunteers, was first lodged in 2010 with the NSW Parliament.

BEECROFT TRAFFIC MEETING

Your Trust President, Kent Ross, along with local Councillors Azizi & Hutchence, plus some 12 local business owners, met in Beecroft Village on Tuesday 15 September regarding parking problems in Beecroft. Council's Deputy General Manager and Traffic & Roads Safety Manager provided good professional capacities. Residents had reported extensive difficulties to the Trust with parking near shops and services worsened by the remaining rail construction vehicles, plus much residential redevelopment construction traffic from Wongala Crescent and Chapman Avenue. Issues and actions are as follows: Taxi Zone in Hannah Street underutilised Council is writing to Taxi Council requesting taxi zone be removed, moved to station Bus Zone or timerestricted to after hours. No Parking Zone at Bottle Shop

No Parking Zone at Bottle Shop used as loading zone frequently & used by visitors Council will trial 5-Minute parking restriction after consultation with businesses between Hannah & Chapman. Start consultation next week.

2P missing on Wongala Cres at commuter car park Council has

requested ETTTA reinstate missing signs, ASAP.

Angle parking at southern end of Wongala. Not feasible due to insufficient road width. Park acquisition would be required. Provide parking delineation lines. Not viable - requirement to mark spaces for largest vehicles means smaller cars cannot use residual areas. Number of vehicles that can park will be reduced from 15 to 11 on western (shop) side of Wongala Cres if marked.

Replace Chapman Ave bus zone with 2P Write to bus operator. Wongala Council car park has mix of 2P and 3P - replace 3P to make all of car park 2P. Not supported as hairdresser and medical services require longer than 2P parking.

Trust President, Kent Ross, said later: "Our community wants to support local businesses in the current, very challenged times – with no local supermarket, and so much construction congestion. The good work of Hornsby Shire Council, to find traffic and parking solutions, is critical to keeping Beecroft's businesses busy."




You're invited to The Big Beecroft Climate Brunch


