The Trust has been invited to make a submission to the Commission of Enquiry. A submission similar to the one drawn up for the R.T.A. will be forwarded to the Commission.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

We hope to have Mr. Brett Doak, City Rail Business Manager at Hornsby available to address the meeting on changes at Beecroft and Cheltenham stations.
The subway at Beecroft has almost been completed, and we thank State Rail for the improvement. The Trust has been advocating this and other work for some time.
Other work scheduled includes some landscaping at both Beecroft and Cheltenham stations, planting of the embankments between Cheltenham and Epping and improvements to parking facilities.
A bus timetable brochure is now available for an hourly overnight, two way bus service between the City and Hornsby via Strathfield.
Bus stops are already in place in Beecroft Road.
