**BEECROFT-CHELTENHAM TRAFFIC ISSUES**

**RTA representatives Mr Brian Walters and Mr John Brewer**

Will be in attendance at this General Meeting to inform local residents of traffic issues that affect their area. In particular, they will speak of the planned use by the Federal Government of Pennant Hills Road as a National Highway Route. They will also speak of plans for Beecroft Road and other local Roads.

**COPELAND ROAD**

A report was recently prepared by Hornsby Council Engineers on the need for additional safety and traffic management provisions along Copeland Road West. This report was prepared as a result of pressure by local residents to review safety measures along this road. The Hornsby Council report recommended that no additional measures were required along this Road. This recommendation is unacceptable to the Beecroft-Cheltenham Civic Trust and also to our local C Riding Councillors. Our local Councillors sought and were successful in having the report sent back to the Council's Work Branch for review, although the use of traffic management devices, eg roundabouts, will not be considered as part of this report. The Trust requests that all concerned residents write to the Council to express their view on this important local matter.

One may only guess as to why the installation of the Copeland Road lights has been repeatedly delayed.

Perhaps it was the widening of Copeland Road (now dropped), the Traffic Plan for Beecroft Centre (where is that now?) or the proposal for a new fire station.
